Early Intervention Services

Early Start Denver Model (ESDM)

ESDM is a relationship based intervention that engages your child in play situations and every day routines through exploration of their interests to gain attention and motivation. Skills are taught across a wide variety of developmental domains.

Other Early Intervention Services:

- Hanen Programs (More than Words, Talkability)
- Transition to School
- Social, Recreational and skill building groups

Behaviour Services

Behaviour Services are available to children and youth with an Autism Spectrum Diagnosis. Families and caregivers will work with their behaviour team to identify priority goal areas and develop intervention plans to meet their individual needs.

DISABILITY FUNDING SOURCES IN ONTARIO

MOST FUNDING APPLICATIONS REQUIRE ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTATION TO COMPLETE. TO ENSURE TIMELY COMPLETION OF APPLICATION, PLEASE HAVE THE FOLLOWING AVAILABLE.

- **Most recent Notice of Assessment**
- **A copy of your child's birth verification (Birth or Baptismal Certificate or Status Card)**
- **A copy of your child's Health Card**
- **Medical documentation confirming your child's diagnosis**
- **Void cheque or Direct Deposit Form**

- CHECK OFF ALL SOURCES APPLIED FOR -

Ontario Autism Program

Provides yearly funding to families with an Autism Spectrum Disorder. Funding amount is Needs Based as assessed by Independent Intake Organization.

Assistance for Children with Severe Disabilities

Provides financial assistance to caregivers to help with the extraordinary costs related to their child's severe disability, it is a direct funding program for low and moderate income families.

Special Services at Home

Provides access to funds for respite and personal development to caregivers who are caring for a child with a developmental and/or physical disability.

Disability Tax Credit

A Canada wide tax credit for individuals who have a severe and prolonged impairment in physical or mental function. *Must be completed by medical professional

Assistive Devices Program

Aids with cost of customized equipment such as communication devices, wheelchairs and hearing aids.

Incontinence Supplies Grant Program (Easter Seals)

For children aged 3 to 18 years with chronic disabilities (physical or developmental) that result in irreversible incontinence or retention

KidSport

Provides financial assistance for registration fees and equipment for children and youth under the age of 18.
