REPORT FROM THE CHAIR AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The past year has certainly been one of considerable change. While still dealing with the lingering effects of the Covid pandemic, the organization saw an influx of new programming, modifications to their infrastructure and continued need to redefine its path forward.

As it relates to programming or service delivery we saw significant changes to the Autism program including ministry issued call for applications for Caregiver Mediated, Entry to School and Urgent Response Services. OKP received new funding to address waitlist and the province announced the development of the SmartStart Hubs across the Children's Treatment Centres. OKP will continue to implement these new initiatives through the 2022-2023 fiscal year.

In terms of infrastructure, the Board and staff of OKP were very pleased to have worked through the design and construction of a new 4,560 square foot building located on the health care campus off Campus Trail in the Town of Huntsville. With the occupancy date of early January the new structure, including its new activity of daily living and Snoezelen multi-sensory rooms, has availed additional approaches to therapies that were not otherwise available. Stay tuned to our Grand Opening date coming soon.

With the above changes and working through the unchartered, new environments as created by pandemic and post-pandemic times, OKP has modified many of its internal practices including numerous LEAN mapping exercises creating new clinical pathways, intake practices as well as numerous other family centered initiatives for our clients and families. The advancements further included the re-scripting of internal practices as they relate to staff and organization facing efficiencies including Information and Human Resource Technology infrastructures, advancements in Business Intelligence and the future of work. Initiatives as they relate to improved stakeholder, donor relations as well as improved family engagement strategies, have also been ongoing.

In closing, we are very encouraged by the significant gains the organization and its dedicated staff and volunteers have achieved over the course of the past year and we look forward to a very strong and promising future for our clients and families. We would like to thank the members of the Board of Directors, donors, our partnering agencies and the members of our community. It is after all 'FOR OUR KIDS'.



Committee Leadership Portfolio: Community and Development Committee (Director)


In February of 2022, Sabrina joined the Board of Directors. Born and raised in North Bay.



Thanks to our many, many corporate and community sponsors that made this another banner year for our organization.




THANK YOU ROTARY CLUB OF HUNTSVILLE!




